







Logical Consequences

Restitution, Restoration, Restriction, Reflection

	Definition	Characteristics	Sample
Restitution 	<p>You broke it, you fix it</p> <p>Opportunity to fix a problem behavior has caused</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Related to behavior • Student initiated • Requires action • Individual or group • May include reflection 	<p>Someone says something to hurt someone's feelings.</p> <p>Student purposely knocks over another student's books.</p>
Restoration 	<p>Opportunity to regain composure/self-control</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Temporary • Removed from situation • Non-punitive • Individual or group • May include reflection 	<p>A student goes to the TAB area to regain composure after becoming frustrated during group work.</p>
Restriction 	<p>Temporary loss of a privilege the student abused</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Temporary • Related to behavior • Individual or group • May include reflection 	<p>A student misuses supplies, so supplies are removed from that student for awhile.</p> <p>A student is moved away from the seat next to a friend after continuing to talk with the friend during silent work time.</p>
Reflection 	<p>Student problem solving</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • May be independent • May be facilitated by another adult or student • Individual or group • Focused on future behavior 	<p>A private social conference with a student following repeated disruptive behaviors.</p>
