Public Policy Agendas Meet Art

In the extended republic of the United States, and among the great variety of interests, parties, and sects, which it embraces, a coalition of a majority of the whole society could seldom take place on any other principles than those of justice and the general good. ---- Federalist No. 51

Setting the political agenda depends on many factors: shared political values, the longstanding traditions of government, the impact of events such as wars or depressions, and the beliefs of those that are considered the political elite. Often citizens don't stop to think about what government is doing, unless it directly affects them. Increasing safety precautions for airlines, allowing fewer restrictions on offshore oil drilling to decrease the cost of gasoline, and raising taxes to offset the cost of a war are all considerations that may cause one to pause and reflect on the individual consequences of the enactment of the policy. However, for the most part, few citizens choose to intently focus on policies relating to the environment, foreign affairs, the economy, or social welfare.

GOAL:

Investigate a variety of public policy issues from both sides of the aisle to better inform the sculpture students on the topics from which they will create wire armatures.

Driving Question:

How can art reflect and inform the public about policy-making agendas?

Group Assignment:

- Brainstorm a topic for EACH of the 4 categories (environmental, social welfare, economic, and foreign policy) that relate to EACH the 4 types of public policy (majoritarian, interest group, client, and entrepreneurial). This means you will have a total of 16 issues! **NOTE: A minimum of 4 topics should specifically relate to PA public policy**
- Investigate EACH of the 16 issues from BOTH the liberal and conservative sides.
- Note who BENEFITS and who pays the COST in each topic.
- Post your detailed information on the created wiki. Follow the guidelines for creating pages in a wiki to ensure uniformity and ease of navigation.
- Note the timeline of public policy making agenda for the researched topics over the last 25 years. (You may wish to go farther back than this.)
- Collaborate with Miss Wolfgang's sculpture class to ensure they understand the topics. (face-to-face interaction)
- Choose one topic to write actual legislation regarding changes in public policy that you would like to see occur. Please include a detailed summary of which committee the bill would be referred to and why, as well as a history of why the bill is needed. This legislation will be presented to the appropriate legislator (PA or US).

Individual Assignment:

- Discussion board interaction on the wiki with Miss Wolfgang's sculpture class. You must post a minimum of **three** times to either pose a question or answer one.
- Comment on the Voicethread that will be created to house photos of the final sculptures. These comments must be a summary of the public policy agenda and the research that was completed during the group phase of the project.
- **Four** reflective Edmodo posts on the process of completing this assignment. What are you learning, what do you still need?
- Choose your *Diigo* articles for the next two weeks to relate to one of the topics. One week must portray the liberal side and one week must portray the conservative side. Be prepared to interact in a discussion via *Diigo* with Miss Wolfgang's class.
